AT OPPOSITION CM MEET

Uddhav: All powers concentrated in one hand, what's meaning of state govt

STRESSING THE need to protect the federal structure and the Constitution, Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray, without naming anyone, said on Wednesday that all powers were being concentrated in one hand in the country.

Uddhav, who was speaking at the Opposition chief ministers' video conference, also said that there is a need to think whether there could be a middle path between the previous tax structure and the existing Goods and Services Tax (GST) regime.

"Rajiv ji (Gandhi) brought the Panchayat Raj, which means decentralisation of power to the smaller institutions. What is happening today? All the powers are getting concentrated in one hand. Then what is the meaning of the state government? Will the state governments no longer be required in the future and one man can rule the country and we will have to just keep nodding? We won't allow it to happen," he said in the meeting called by Congress

president Sonia Gandhi.

"Dr Ambedkar has drafted the Constitution keeping in mind the federal structure of our country. If we do not respect whatever rights are given to everyone in that Constitution, then where is our democracy? If we talk about democracy, then our Constitution and federal structure are at the top of it and we have to protect it," said Uddhav. "It is our duty to run the government but it is also our job to protect the Constitution," he added.

The CM also mentioned that while Maharashtra's GST dues are increasing with every passing month, the Centre is yet to pay the state.

About GST, Uddhav said, "Whether there is a need to consider it. Something can be done about it. If we bring some changes, it can be good or bad. If there is a mistake, we have to correct it and move forward. But we need to think whether there could be a middle path between the previous tax regime and the existing structure," he said, adding that the state has not received GST compensation since April.

Mundhe shunted out, 16 other IAS officers transferred

A DAY after he tested positive for the novel coronavirus, high-profile bureaucrat Tukaram Mundhe was abruptly transferred out of the Nagar Municipal Corporation on Wednesday. Continuing to reject the bureaucracy, Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray approved transfers of 16 bureaucrats.

In his short stint as the Nagar municipal commissioner, Mundhe, a 2005-batch IAS officer, was at loggerheads with senior corporators in the BJP-ruled civic body. He has now been posted as the member secretary of Maharashtra Jeevan Pradhikaran, seen as a light posting.

Radhakrishnan B (2008) has succeeded him as the Nagar civic chief. Among transfers of senior bureaucrats, Additional Chief Secretary Sujata Sinha (1987) was appointed as new general administration secretary, replacing Sitaram Kunte (1985),

who has been appointed as home secretary. Lokesh Chandra (1993) was appointed as principal secretary, water resources, while Anshu Sinha (1995) will be the new skill development secretary. Shekhar Channe (2003) will be the new vice-chairman and managing director of MSRTC, while Avinash Dhakane (2010) has succeeded him to the transport commissioner's post.

S M Deshpande (1991) will take over as the new principal secretary of administration, resources and operational maintenance, while Anasahar Misal (2003) is the new Konkani divisional commissioner.

N Ramaswami (2004), formerly Chief Executive Officer, Maharashtra Maritime Board, was newly positioned as commissioner (family welfare) and director, National Health Mission. Other officers transferred include Vimla R. Naresh Gite (both 2009), Kailash Jadhav, Chandrakant Dange (both 2010), Deepa Mudholkar (2011), S S Patil (both 2011) and Rohan Ghuge (2018).

BJP to stage agitation, demands reopening of religious places

THE BJP has called for an agitation on August 29 demanding to re-open places of worship in Maharashtra. Calling the agitation ghastanad, state BJP president Chandrakant Patil on Wednesday said, "The statewide protest will see participation from religious leaders and heads of temples."

Patil said protesters will ring bells, blow conchshells, and beat drums to draw the attention of the state government. "The Centre has already issued directives allowing state governments to lift lockdown from all places of worship, including temples. Following this, several temples have reopened and are fully functioning."

He also said the demand had not only come from religious leaders and organisations, but also from people across urban and rural areas who wanted daily rituals such as bhajan-kirtan to resume. The closure of temples had adversely affected lakhs of livelihoods, he added.

The protest will be staged outside temples such as Shirdi, Pandharpur, Tuljapur, Kolhapur, Trimbakeshwar. In every city and town, BJP workers will stage demonstrations.

Alleging NCP interference, Parbhani's Shiv Sena MP resigns

IN A sign of increasing tussle between Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) allies, Shiv Sena MP from Parbhani, Sanjay Jadhav, has tendered his resignation to Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray, alleging NCP's interference in appointing a non-governmental administrative body to manage the affairs of the agriculture produce market committee (APMC) at Jintur in Parbhani.

In a letter to the CM, Jadhav, a second-term Sena MP from the Marathwada region, said he had been trying for the last eight to 10 months to appoint a Sena-led body to the APMC but had failed to do so as the NCP's body has been appointed for the second time. "It has pained me a lot and the Sena activists are also unhappy. If I am not able to give justice to the activists, despite having administrative authority, I will not moral right to continue as MP," Jadhav wrote in the letter dated August 25.

Jadhav said how can the party expand if workers do not get justice. "I am tendering my resignation to you willfully after

Fishermen to get up to Rs 30,000 cash as one-time compensation

FISHING BOAT owners from Maharashtra will receive a one-time cash compensation up to Rs 30,000. In the aftermath of the Covid-19 pandemic and sustained losses to the fishing business in the last couple of years, the Uddhav Thackeray-led government on Wednesday handed out a special relief package to the community.

Under the package, licensed fishing boat owners will be entitled to a cash dose ranging from Rs 5,000 to Rs 30,000, depending on type of boat and fishing. The government has also announced a one-time grant of Rs 3,000 to help fish sellers procure ice boxes.

Government statistics show that 76,345 households in the state are directly dependent on fishing, while another 9,93 lakh indirectly benefit from it. The government has contended that the relief package would benefit 54,573 households at a cost of Rs 65 crore to the state exchequer.

State Fisheries Minister Aslam Shaikh, who is from the Congress, said, "The government has tried to extend some relief to fishing community facing challenges due to mounting losses."

Giving out details of the package, he said the state has 19,703 licensed fishing boats, including 18,009 mechanised and 1,564 non-mechanised ones. The government has announced a one-time help of Rs 10,000 each for

traditional fishers who use drag net, Rs 20,000 each for fishing using non-mechanised and low-end mechanised boats that use one or two-cylinder engines. Three and four cylinder engine boats will get Rs 30,000 each, while high-powered (six cylinder engines or more) boats will receive Rs 40,000.

Of the 15,402 registered boats, records show that 7,671 or nearly 43 per cent fall in the high-powered category and would, therefore, stand to receive Rs 40,000. Another 48 per cent of boat owners (8,712) either own non-mechanised or low-end mechanised boats. They will be entitled to Rs 20,000 each. The government has anticipated 35,000 fish sellers to opt for relief for ice box procurement.

Nurses protest for permanent posts, leaves; many others to join in on Sept 1

A SECTION of nurses on Wednesday began a protest across Maharashtra demanding permanent posting, more leaves and risk allowance while on Covid-19 duty. From September 1, more nurses are set to join in, though they will continue to work and wear black ribbons as a mark of protest.

At least 450 nurses across government hospitals have contracted Covid-19, and six of them have succumbed, data from the Maharashtra State Nurses Association showed.

The nurses are also demanding that they be allowed to undergo an adequate quarantine period. A month ago, the state government had changed duty hours for nurses posted in Covid-19 wards. From working seven days at one go, followed by seven days in quarantine, the public health department had last month asked nurses to report for work for five days and then take leave for two days.

Medical colleges have asked nurses to work for seven days at a stretch and then undergo a three-day quarantine.

"If we come in contact with an infected patient, we don't get enough time to observe quarantine. We ourselves can become the carriers of the virus if we report to work after three days. PPE (personal protective equipment) kit and masks that we use are of poor quality," said Sumitra Tote, a nurse in a Late Government Medical College.

New nurses are being recruited at a salary of Rs 25,000 to Rs 30,000 per month by the department. "Because of poor pay and contractual jobs, nurses are

not willing to work in government hospitals. The ones left are overburdened. One nurse is managing 20 patients in the ICU here," Tote said.

The Maharashtra State Nurses Association, United Nurses Association and Government Nurses Federation plan to protest from September 1 till 7 by wearing black ribbons so that Covid-19 patients are not affected by the strike. Nurses under the banner of Government Nurses Federation began the protest on Wednesday.

"On September 8 we will not report to work if our demands are not taken seriously," said Arun Kadam, executive president of Maharashtra State Nurses Association.

Around 15,000 to 20,000 nurses are expected to join the protest. They have also demanded that the state government provides a risk allowance of Rs 7,200 per month as well as permanent postings to the contractual staff, and fill vacant posts.

T J Chinn, from United Nurses Association, said the demands have been long pending. "We have no option but to protest. Nurses have been demanding better pay and a safe working environment since the onset of the pandemic," he added.

Dr Sadhana Tayade, Director of the Directorate of Health Services, said the decision to shorten the seven-day quarantine period was taken due to lack of nursing staff. "We have given advertisements for nursing posts, but we are not getting responses. We not only need to fill vacant posts but also require more nurses in rural areas. We had to reduce the quarantine period to accommodate whoever was available."

She added that the process of converting contractual posts into permanent ones will take time.
